### Immunization Guidelines for 6th and 9th Grade Students

State law requires that all children entering school in West Virginia for the <u>first</u> time, unless properly medically exempted, must be immunized against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio, measles, and rubella. Private physicians may not authorize requirements or exemptions conflicting with those standing requirements for first time enterers.

In addition to the standard school entry requirements, the following immunizations are <u>recommended</u> for sixth and ninth grade students in West Virginia:

## Sixth (6<sup>th</sup>) Grade Students

Tdap / Td

Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis / Tetanus, Diphtheria

One dose recommended for children who have not had a booster since

kindergarten entry.

MCV4/MPSV4

Meningococcal

One dose recommended.

**HPV** Three doses recommended for female students.

Human Papillomavirus Standard schedule: First dose at age 11-12. Second dose 2 months

after the first dose. Third dose 6 months after the first dose.

## Ninth (9th) Grade Students \*\*

Tdap / Td

Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis Tetanus, Diphtheria One dose recommended for children who have not had a booster since

kindergarten entry.

MCV4/MPSV4

Human Papillomavirus

Meningococcal

One dose recommended, if not previously given.

<u>HPV</u>

Three doses recommended for female students, if not previously given

See standard schedule noted above.

# WV Bureau for Public Health recommends that vaccine doses administered $\leq 4$ days before the minimum interval or age be counted as valid

\*\* Exceptions: <u>Tdap / Td</u>: Children entering the 9th grade do not need Tdap/Td vaccine if they were vaccinated at 6th grade entry or at any time since. <u>MCV4 / MPSV4</u>: Children entering the 9th grade do not need Meningococcal vaccine if they were vaccinated at 6th grade entry or at any time since. <u>HPV</u>: Female children entering the 9th grade do not need HPV vaccine if they received three doses at 6th grade entry or at any time since.
